Advancing Student Success: Campus Conversations

- Focused small group conversations with community partners, staff, faculty, undergraduate students and graduate students (main campus and non-main campus/online), Native American students, and student leadership.
- Engagement Timeline: June September.
- Completed 14 out of 21 and met with over 300 individuals so far in these sessions.
- Met with additional community members via other meetings and engagements
- Hearing many recurring themes:
 - Advising needs
 - Coordination of services
 - Increased communication
 - Better transfer pathways



Academic Success Goals (ASGs)

Advancing the Strategic Imperatives

The Academic Success Goals serve as a guiding framework for all faculty, staff, and students involved in advancing the university's academic mission.

- Retreat with the deans, Provost Integrative Leadership Team and Faculty
 Senate Executive Committee to formulate the ASGs and determine metrics.
- Working with UAIR and campus partners to determine how to obtain data for the metrics and track progress.
- Next steps-integrating data from UAIR and Provost conversations to ensure priorities are integrated in the ASGs



Student Success Goals

- 2 % increase in retention over the next 3 years to get to 90%
- 2% increase in graduation rates over the next 5 years
 - Target to get from 55% to 65% for 4 years and to 85% for 6 years
- 95% for career outcomes
 where our graduates have a job
 or are in graduate school



Enrollment/Admission Initiative

- Streamline and enhance enrollment, admissions, financial aid and merit allocation, and onboarding/welcome programs.
- Support students from admission through graduation to promote timely degree completion.
- Coordinate and integrate student services and resources > First Year
 Student Experience

- Enhancing the student experience through structured advising milestones and integrated support.







Academic Initiative

UNIV 101 & 301 Task Force

- Purpose: Advisory task force to review and improve UNIV 101 and 301, core components of the 32credit general education curriculum.
- Primary Focus: Enhancing UNIV 101 through design thinking to refine course goals, learning outcomes, and implementation strategies.
- Scope of Work:
 - Identify course strengths, limitations, and opportunities for improvement.
 - Ensure alignment with university-wide student success priorities.
- Membership: Includes students, faculty, staff, and academic leaders.
- **Deliverable:** A final report with recommendations and action plans.
