

President's Updates

November 3, 2025, Faculty Senate

- On October 24, I participated in an uplifting discussion with regents and Banner Health leadership about the
 U of A Banner partnership as we <u>celebrated 10 years and shared initial results of an economic impact</u>
 <u>study</u>. Banner leaders also attended the Arizona Football game on October 11, hosting a tailgate for Banner
 employees and community partners here in Southern Arizona. Planning is underway to sustain our success
 over the next ten years.
- **Federal compact:** We have received an overwhelmingly positive response to my <u>message on the university's</u> <u>feedback to the federal government</u> about their proposal to advance excellence in higher education. I appreciate the messages we have received, and I thank our shared governance partners and others for engaging in the deliberation process.
- I have enjoyed several engagements with our colleges and centers throughout the fall. Most recently, I visited the College of Medicine Tucson, which gave me the chance to hear from some of our top biomedical and healthcare researchers. Other visits this semester have included excellent tours of the College of Veterinary Medicine, Andrew Weil Center for Integrative Medicine, and W.A. Franke Honors College. I also was very pleased to help celebrate faculty accomplishments at the fifth annual Luminaries awards.
- The UA Foundation has reported the best quarter of fundraising in U of A history, with \$76.4 million in new gifts and commitments closed from July 1 through October 1. The previous best quarter was \$57.2 million in FY 24.
- Arizona Athletics has announced a \$5 million from R. Ken Coit, naming the Director of Athletics position, and a \$4.4 million estate gift from alumnus Paul Miscenti, which will benefit all student-athletes.
- On October 20, Community Relations held a community partner lunch with more than 50 local leaders. I
 was very pleased to help host the event, providing an update on our strategic imperatives following this
 group's engagement in their creation at a February 2025 meeting. Provost Prelock also joined to share
 details of her implementation work throughout campus.
- On-campus interviews have concluded for this year's Arizona Legislative Internship Program (ALIP), with 27 of 47 U of A candidates invited to the second round of interviews at the state legislature. GCR continues to work with our students to ensure we have a strong showing during the 2026 Legislative Session.
- University Communications and Marketing coordinated a visit and filming with U of A alumna and host of
 "Today," Savannah Guthrie. The segment is expected to air on NBC on November 5 and across U of A and
 NBC digital channels leading up to that date.
- The **Office of Public Safety** (OPS) held multiple Safety Strolls over the last month, including with the Panhellenic and Inter-Fraternity Council. Each was well attended, with 40-50 students per session. Additionally, OPS reports increased adoption of the SafeCats mobile app based on feedback and informal surveying of the attendees during these events.
