Fall 2025 Student Census Data

- Official Fall Census data, which captures a point-in-time data view for the University of Arizona student body on the 21st day of the fall semester, is now available. UAIR has worked diligently to provide data breakdowns, institutional metrics, and key highlights from the Fall 2025 Census Report.
- This year's Fall Census snapshot took place on September 15, 2025, and captured all transactional activity up until September 14, 2025.
- Fall 2025 student census data was released on September 25, 2025 and is accessible through key UAccess Analytics dashboards and Arizona Profiles. By mid-October, all census data will be updated in

the Interactive Fact Book on the UAIR website, following the Fall 2025 Workforce Census Snapshot.

U of A Microcampuses in China

 Aligning with federal expectations, the University of Arizona <u>immediately terminated</u> its China-based microcampus agreements.
We have communicated directly with those affected and are working with enrolled students to help them continue their education.

The university is closely monitoring the situation and supporting our research community.
