Representatives visited campus last week to meet with Associate Deans for Research, Deans, and Vice Provosts. Discussions focused on college-specific projects, training plans, and support for identifying and nominating faculty for honorific awards.

NCFDD "Rethinking Your Research Funding" Workshop

The Office of the Provost and the Office of Research and Partnerships jointly funded faculty participation in this workshop.

46 faculty members participated (out of 60 available slots – 77% filled)

Participant breakdown:

- o 70% Tenure-track
- o 15% Other (postdocs, researchers, staff, emeritus)
- o 9% Continuing Status
- o 6% Career-track

Most participants were at the Assistant and Associate ranks.

Faculty represented colleges across campus, with a strong showing from CALES/Cooperative Extension.

Feedback was highly positive, highlighting the workshop's practical strategies and supportive community.
